Missouri Families to Receive 300,000 Free CyberSafely.ai Licenses Statewide as Kids Head Back to School

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., August 27, 2026 - CyberSafely.ai is making 300,000 free licenses available to Missouri families statewide, a K-8 focused offer that gives parents an AI-powered tool to protect their kids online as students return to school. Family onboarding is already live at <https://cybersafely.ai/welcome>, and the offer is open to Missouri families with a K-8 child.

The statewide framing has been cleared, and Superintendent Michael Nutter has secured approval from the Missouri School Boards Association (MSBA) for the statewide announcement. It surfaces risk signals as they happen rather than keeping a record of a child's day, notifying parents through a parent dashboard so they can step in early rather than after harm is done. The tool is built with a focus on K-8 families, the age group where parents most often need help knowing when something is going wrong online.

Missouri families with a K-8 child can claim one of the 300,000 free licenses and set up protection through a guided process at <https://cybersafely.ai/welcome>. The setup is designed to be quick, and support is available for families who want help getting started.

Back-to-school season brings a surge in the online activity that worries parents most, from group chats and social feeds to gaming platforms and direct messages. Parents consistently say they understand the risks their children face online. What they lack is a way to know when a risk is actually reaching their own child. CyberSafely.ai is built to close that gap.
